FAIRFAX CIVITANS VISIT CIRC

Civitan Steve & Dee Leonard, from the *Fairfax Club*, had the opportunity to tour the Civitan International Research Center (CIRC) on June 4th, 2010 while on a trip to visit family.

Steve & Dee were warmly welcomed to the center by Anne Waites, Program Director at CIRC (left), and Dr. Susan Campbell, Assistant Director for Research, Development & Outreach (right). Susan is a postdoctoral fellow conducting cancer-related research in the laboratory of Dr. Harold Sontheimer. She also is featured in the July Civitan Magazine for her work in chartering (and becoming the charter president) of the new Research Civitan Club.



Highlights of the tour included a visit to Dr. Sontheimer's lab, meeting several scientists there who described their work, and a stop at the lab where the Siemens 3.0 Tesla functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI) scanner is being used to study autism, ADHD, Schizophrenia, and cerebral palsy in real time. Ms. Waites & Dr. Campbell gratefully acknowledged the generous and faithful support of the Chesapeake District in helping CIRC make great strides in research, prevention, and treatment of developmental disabilities through biomedical and medical research and clinical practice.

Friday, March 26, 2010 – 1:15 pm

The Chesapeake District Board meeting, held on March 26th, 2010 at the Doubletree Hotel in Annapolis, Maryland was called to order by Governor Maribeth Jacobs at 1:15 pm. Pledge to the flag was led by Larry "Moe" Mattox. The Civitan Creed was lead by David Shirk. Invocation was by District Chaplain Lydia Harvey. Maribeth introduced our guests, Charlie Jackowski, International Director and his wife Patty, and Louis Stephens, Vice President of Membership and Leadership. The Secretary's Report was given by Dee Leonard. Maribeth announced that David Bridges, District Treasurer could not be at the meeting. Members were asked to e-mail or phone David with questions or comments. Reimbursement forms are available from Jo Ann O'Toole.

The following reports were received:

Area I – Thom Minnis

Norfolk Club - Member of 19 years, Elizabeth Goins passed away and will be sorely missed. The club received the Elwyn Hepple Award with honors for outstanding community service; was active assisting Special Olympics, and other community projects.

Peninsula Club –Thanksgiving activities and Christmas projects kept members busy. . The club supported Special Olympics, Leaders in Freedom, and had several interesting speakers.

Area V – Sue Hepworth

The *Annapolis Club* added 2 members; the *Bowie Club* raised funds with White House Ornament sales and the Variety Show.

Area III – David Wahl

The Arlington Club lost two long time members, William Joslyn & Preston Sewel. The club pared down the membership list to 15 and have added 3 new members since then.

The MVLE Club continues to be an enthusiastic club. They will be adding 17 new members and enjoy many hands on projects including making placemats.

The Tysons Club, Proud Hearts and Fairfax Clubs continue their work in the area.

The Leesburg Club is in the process of rebuilding and will be called the Greater Loudoun Civitan Club.

Area IV – Eugene Kinder

The area includes 2 states and had 4 active, growing clubs. Gene challenged other Civitans to watch for "Stealable ideas" from other Area and Club reports

The Martinsburg Club will hold its golf tournament from which 100% of funds goes to CIRC. The club is creating display boards to highlight projects and the organizations supported by Civitan. These will help the public know more about Civitan.

The Frederick & Frederick Challenger Clubs are doing lots of projects including an Indoor Golf Tournament.

The Tri-State Club in Hagerstown has two big projects – a "Money" Bingo and a Restaurant Coupon Book.

Area VI – Moe Mattox

The Salem Club is currently inactive

The GI Tinker Mountain Club is active and is amply supported by the *Roanoke Club*.

The Roanoke Club has 80 members with 20-22 attending each meeting.

Region 4 Report from International Director Charlie Jackowski

Charlie reported that work is still being done on the 501(c)3 work with IRS. Problems with the Master Business File are being resolved. We are hoping that the approval will be "soon."

The International Convention this year is in Cancun from September 3-6. In 2011, the Civitan International Convention will be in New Orleans from 8/24-27/2011.

Campus clubs and Junior Civitan clubs are doing well. The Junior Civitan Convention is from June 24-27.

The Young Scientist program funded by money from the Chesapeake District and Foundation is drawing bright young scientists into the field of developmental disabilities and disorders.

Both Dr. Sontheimer and Dr. Wadiche told of the exciting research that is going on at CIRC. This included information about Asberger's Syndrome which is a high functioning form of autism. Reported cases are increasing beyond what could be explained by better reporting. Dr. Wadiche made an interesting presentation about her research on newborn stem cells.

Leadership and training has made advances now yielding 80% of all Civitan clubs have sent officers to training. The coming International Convention for this year is in Cancun, Mexico. The 2011 convention will be in New Orleans, LA from August 24-27, 2011. Currently International is exploring European sites for the 2012 Convention. Junior Civitan is growing and has had an increase. The President's Council is also seeing an increase. The 501(c) 3 approval from IRS is moving along. International is currently working on the master file to make changes in accordance with IRS requirements. Many international sites are being considered for club building – especially the United Kingdom, Hungary, Sweden, and Ghana.

Job Title: Field Director of Club Development
Department: Membership—Leadership of Civitan International
Reports to: Vice President of Membership—Leadership of Civitan International
Location: Satellite office in home within district/area boundaries

Job Summary:

Responsible for managing the direction, assistance, support, and training in new club building activities within the assigned geographic district. Work with district's officers in addition to working with accredited and certified club building teams to develop goals and objectives for chartering new Civitan clubs.

Job Responsibilities:

Accredited and Certified Club Building Team:

Work closely with members trained as Accredited and Certified Club Builders to develop goals, strategies, and plans to charter new Civitan clubs in communities throughout the geographic area of the district.
Guide or assist with all correspondence and communications of the club building process.
Participate in weekly visits and meetings with key prospects of target communities for new clubs.
Participate in weekly pre-charter meetings of new clubs in target communities.
Train members to become Accredited Club Builders.
Train Accredited and Certified Club Builders in skills for recruiting prospects into both new and existing clubs.
Follow-up by communicating with new club officers and new club development team to ensure the new club's success in first 18-24 months.
Keynote speaker at pre-charter meetings and as needed throughout process.

District Officers – Governor:

Work closely with district governor and his/her elected and appointed district officers to ensure that the district is developing goals with objective to build and charter new clubs.
Develop, implement, and evaluate the district's new club goals with the governor and district officers.
Identify and address tasks that lead to new clubs and motivate the district officers to assist as motivators and club builders to accomplish tasks.
Provide communication, direction, and leadership based on the district officers' new club directives.
Ensure district officers (governor/area directors) are working with existing clubs to educate and develop sponsoring clubs with timelines and target communities.
Train district and club officers to become more effective in recruiting prospects into their own clubs.
Communicate monthly with key district officers regarding their efforts in promoting new clubs within their areas.

THE CLOWNS CAME

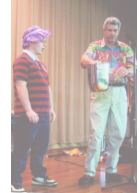
